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Tomatin unveils The Italian Collection: a trio of single malts finished in Italian wine casks

Highland distillery reveals its latest trio of country-inspired expressions

Award-winning Highland distillery, Tomatin, has unveiled an exceptional new limited-edition range, The Italian Collection.

This trio of single malt scotch whiskies (46% ABV, non-chill filtered, RRP £70) demonstrates Tomatin's craftsmanship, combining the exceptional Highland malt with the aromatic richness of Italian wine casks, resulting in a harmonious blend of flavours.

First laid down in December 2010, the whisky has been gently matured in traditional oak casks for 10 years, before being finished in Marsala, Amarone and Barolo wine casks for a further two years.

Each cask has imparted its unique character into the whisky, creating a trio of expressions that pay homage to Italy's esteemed wine regions.

The Marsala Edition opens with enticing aromas of panettone and candied lime, leading to a palate that delights in the flavours of white chocolate, lemon truffles and hazelnuts. A sweet citrus finish emerges, accompanied by notes of toasted oak.

Aromas of poached pears and traditional rhubarb and custard sweets surface from **The Amarone Edition**. On the palate, notes of strawberry jam, Turkish delight and light butter pastry unfold. A luxuriously rich finish boasts cinnamon-spiced red apples.

The Barolo Edition begins with aromas of mulled wine and dark chocolate. On the palate, spiced mead intermingles with cranberry, while an undercurrent of fresh citrus, reminiscent of grapefruit, adds vibrancy. The finish is marked by light tannin and delicate sugared almonds.

The Italian Collection is the third release from the distillery's country-inspired ranges, which have all demonstrated Tomatin's dedication to cask selection and their first class wood policy.

A true celebration of both Scotland's heritage and Italy's illustrious wine history, where wine has been an integral part of cultural traditions for over 4,000 years, the Italian Collection also nods to Tomatin's *To What Matters* brand platform, which celebrates the importance of human connection, and honours the legacy of the people and place involved in the creation of the finest Highland whisky.

"The Italian Collection combines the rich tapestry of Italian wine culture with our elegant Highland single malt whisky. Italy has a historic, unrivalled passion for single malt scotch whisky,



so this latest trio of releases, is a tribute to that longstanding relationship with a unique take on our traditional Highland malt.

"We wanted to capture the essence of Italian wine, its history, nature, landscape and traditions and weave it into our whisky, all embodied within a single glass. Each expression in this collection is a testament to the seamless blending of these two worlds, offering a truly exceptional tasting experience for whisky lovers."

- Nose: panettone and candied limes
- Palate: white chocolate, lemon truffles and hazelnut
- Finish: sweet citrus with blood orange accompanied by notes of toasted oak

The Amarone Edition tasting notes:

- Nose: poached pears and traditional rhubarb and custard sweets
- Palate: strawberry jam accompanied by Turkish delight and light butter pastry
- **Finish:** cinnamon spiced red apple

The Barolo Edition tasting notes:

- Nose: mulled wine and dark chocolate
- Palate: spiced mead with cranberry and underlying fresh citrus in the form of grapefruit
- Finish: light tannin and sugared almonds

Tomatin is located in the Scottish Highlands (near Inverness) and is famous for its portfolio of soft and mellow whiskies, including a core range, a limited-edition range and a premium archive range (prices range from £35 - £17,500). Tomatin has been dedicated to protecting its craft, its environment and particularly its community, which is at the very heart of the brand. Many of the craftspeople working on site have been doing so their entire working lives – all working towards producing a wide range of single malts, beloved across the world.

In 2022, Tomatin launched its new brand platform, 'To What Matters' - designed to remind people about the important things in life. 'To What Matters' is the latest chapter in the brand's evolution; a positive call to arms that represents the spiritual DNA of Tomatin - a human belief in what's truly important in life. The significant moments.

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Recognition of the Highland distillery's craftsmanship continues to grow globally. In 2022, Tomatin was awarded 'Scotch Whisky Producer of the Year' and 'Outstanding Spirits Producer of the Year' at the International Wine & Spirit Competition. Later that year, it was recognised as 'Sustainable Distillery of the Year' at Whisky Magazine's Icons of Whisky 2023, in recognition of its continued contribution to sustainably at the distillery.

In 2023, Tomatin's Legacy single malt, part of the core range, was awarded Gold at the International Wine & Spirit Competition. It also took home seven awards at the San Francisco World Spirits Competition, while Cù Bòcan, which is produced at the distillery in limited batches every winter, took home three. Later that year, Tomatin's 36 Year Old single malt was recognised as 'Best in Show' at the SFWSC, officially making it one of the best whiskies in the world.
